
INDEPENDENCE CHURCH OF CHRIST~ JANUARY 7, 2024

INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LII: 1 Thessalonians

On his Second Missionary Journey, Paul along with Silas entered Thessalonica, a Macedonian city west-southwest of Philippi with a large enough population of Jews to have a synagogue. There Paul "reasoned" for "three sabbath days," "opening and alleging, that Christ must needs have suffered, and risen again from the dead; and that this Jesus, whom I preach unto you, is Christ" (Acts 17:2,3). His success was immediate (Acts 17:4) as was the opposition to him (Acts 17:5-10). While Paul was not in Thessalonica very long on that occasion, the congregation in Thessalonica would prove to be a good and strong one. She loved all the brethren in her area (1 The. 4:9,10), and even in persecution she was a light to others (1 The. 1:7; cf 1:6; 2:14). Paul was thankful for her (2 The. 2:13) and his desire was that they remain sound (2 The. 2:15) and that God would comfort and stablish them "in every good word and work" (2 The. 2:17)!

Paul wrote (1 The. 2:18), apparently with Silas and Timothy as amanuenses, to this congregation of the Lord's church (1 The. 1:1). It is evident that Paul wrote the epistle from the region of Achaia (1 The. 1:7,8) which included Athens and Corinth; though the uninspired postscript says Paul wrote from Athens, it is possible that Paul wrote this epistle from Corinth where Silas and Timothy ultimately met him (Acts 18:5) after having been left behind in Berea (Acts 17:14,15). That said, Paul had gone to Athens, and had been met in Athens by Timothy at some point, for he had sent Timothy back to Thessalonica from Athens (1 The. 3:1,2); Timothy had since returned to Paul (1 The. 3:6), possibly with Silas and possibly to Corinth. Paul was in Corinth for a year and a half (Acts 18:11), ultimately appearing before Gallio who was there in A.D. 51 and 52 (Acts 18:12-17). Paul remained in Corinth, would have been written sometime around A.D. 51 or 52; as he did not arrive with or leave with Gallio, it could have been around A.D. 50 or 53. It is likely earlier (A.D. 50) rather than later, however, given Paul's being anxious to hear of the Thessalonians affairs.

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
