INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XXVII: Daniel

Though it is one of the "Major Prophets," the book of Daniel is short enough that it could have been included in the books of prophets labeled "Minor" (having fewer chapters than either Hosea or Zechariah); however, this short book packs a massive amount of material in a very small space! It contains history and prophecy, narrative and apocalypse. It speaks to its present (Babylon and Medo-Persia), to its near future (Greece), and to its distant future (Rome and the church).

The book is named for the one who is repeatedly identified as its author, Daniel (7:15,28; 8:15,27; 9:2; 10:2,7; 12:5). Daniel was an affluent (apparently royal) young man of Judah (Dan. 1:6) who was carried captive to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar in 606 B.C. (Dan. 1:1,3,4). Daniel was godly and principled in spite of his youth and of his location well away from Jerusalem (Dan. 1:8). Daniel would be one of the most important prophets of the Old Testament; moreover, he would prophesy perhaps longer than any other. His prophetic work began during the reign of the Babylonian [really Neo-Babylonian or Chaldean] Nebuchadnezzar (about 603 B.C. [Dan. 2:1]) and continued into the reign of the Persian Cyrus (about 536 B.C. [Dan. 1:21]). The date of the book, therefore, would be soon after 536 B.C., and the writing of the book would have taken place from Babylon.

The audience of the book was as varied as its subjects. Daniel was writing to the captive Jews in general, Babylonian rulers in parts, and future Jews and the church in prospect. Daniel's varied audience helps to explain a curiosity of the book, that is, his having written Daniel 2:4-7:28 in Aramaic (fitting the Mesopotamian location of Babylon and Persia) rather than Hebrew. His ultimate purpose in writing was to show the place of contemporary and future nations in God's plan to establish His kingdom, the church.

The key words of Daniel's prophecy are "kingdom," representing either physical and spiritual kingdoms (used fifty-nine times in its combined singular and plural forms); "dominion," showing power or rule (found eighteen times); "power," showing strength (used thirteen times); and "horn," which apocalyptically pictured kings as instruments of force (used nineteen times in its singular and plural). The key phrase described God; thirteen times in Daniel He is called "the most High." The key verse echoes that thought: "The king answered unto Daniel, and said, Of a truth *it is,* that your God *is* a God of gods, and a Lord of kings, and a revealer of secrets, seeing thou couldest reveal this secret" (Dan. 2:47).
