
## INDEPENDENCE CHURCH OF CHRIST~ JANUARY 24, 2021

### "AMEN AND A-WOMAN" Daniel F. Cates

Editor's note: Last week, I included an article written by Brett Petrillo which addressed the general ignorance of men toward Christianity. I have included here an email which I sent in response to an article (https://www.kansascity.com/news/local/news-columnsblogs/the-buzz/article248266055.html) which I read saying that the representative was merely making a pun.

#### Dear Mr. Lowry,

Thank you for your consideration of these thoughts which I am expressing with regard to your article, "Missouri Rep. Cleaver Says His 'A-woman' Prayer Is Misconstrued to Stoke Division."

While Representative Cleaver claimed to have intended "Amen and A-woman" as a pun, I would suggest if it were that, it was a pun which, ironically, took lightly—even "made fun of"—the issue of chauvinism. In reality, it was not a pun, it was pandering—that is far from taking lightly a politically sensitive topic; that is taking lightly what to a "Methodist minister" ought to be a solemn address to God. In reality, I would suggest that he was not *really* speaking to God, he was speaking to his constituents.

I would add that the representative likewise took lightly his God in referring to Him as "the monotheistic god, Brahma, and god known by many names by many different faiths." God is not equivalent to Brahma—that is a blasphemous thought, especially from one who would call himself a "Christian."

In reality, Representative Cleaver was mocking God while making points with a political ideology; however, "Be not deceived; God is not mocked" (Galatians 6:7).

Again, thank you for considering these thoughts. I am sure that your time is valuable.
