INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part VI: Joshua

The book of Joshua is named for the leader who is its primary focus. The name Joshua, or Oshea or Jehoshua (Num. 11:26), are forms of the name Jesus, meaning "savior" or "deliverer"; in fact this is what he was called in Acts 7:45 and Hebrews 4:8. After the death of Moses, the children of Israel fell under the oversight of Moses' subordinate, Joshua (Deu. 34:9), who had entered the Biblical scene as a military leader (Exo. 17:9), was Moses' minister (Exo. 24:13), that is, servant (Exo. 33:11). Joshua was one of two spies, with Caleb, who had brought back a good report regarding the prospect of taking Canaan--the other ten, fearful, caused the heart of the people to melt and so to perish in the wilderness (Num. 14:6-10; Jos. 14:8; Num. 14:23). The book of Joshua records Joshua's leading the younger generation into the Promised Land (cf Deu. 31:3).

Joshua may be the primary subject, but did he write the book? It is likely that he did, but as his death is recorded in Joshua 24:29, he may not have written the whole thing--though, as with Moses' possibly writing Deuteronomy's record of his death, inspiration could allow him to have foreseen it. Regarding his authorship, Joshua 24:26 appears conclusive; it reads, "And Joshua wrote these words in the book of the law of God, and took a great stone, and set it up there under an oak, that was by the sanctuary of the LORD." On the surface that may seem to demonstrate authorship of the whole, but verse 25 specifically refers to the covenant that Joshua made with God's people on that day. The verse, then, does not unquestionably demonstrate his authorship of all of the book, but it surely demonstrates that he had some role in writing at least some of it. If he did not write all of the book, who may have written about his death--or even more? Jewish tradition pointed toward Eleazar or Phinehas, son and grandson of Aaron, respectively (Exo. 6:25). Eleazar, though, also died in the course of the book (Jos. 24:33). Whoever wrote any or all of the book is ultimately immaterial, for the Holy Spirit put the words in the writer(s) (II Tim. 3:16).

The book of Joshua continued the history begun by Moses, picking up at his death. The close of the book, ending with the aforementioned deaths of Joshua and Eleazar, directly preceded the book of Judges which begins, "Now after the death of Joshua it came to pass, ..." (Jud. 1:1). The exact date of the close of the book is unknown, but two things indicate that it covered a substantial period of time: first, Joshua was 110 years old at his death (Jos. 24:29); and, second, "Joshua made war a long time" (Jos. 11:18) and had rested from war a long time (Jos. 23:1). The penning of the book would have been at the close of Joshua's days or

shortly thereafter, that is, toward the middle of the fourteenth century B.C. Joshua probably would have been written from Shechem where Joshua gathered the tribes and made a covenant with them (Jos. 24:1,25) and where Joseph's bones were buried (Jos. 24:32; cf Gen. 50:25; Exo. 13:19; Heb. 11:22). Those Israelites who entered the Promised Land and their descendants were the audience of the book who were receiving in it a continuing history of their people. (*To be continued next week*)
