PURITY IN JUDGMENT, Part 6

(Continued from the last bulletin) Outward or inward

An extremely important consideration is this: Is the judgment really about the person being judged? The judging could be of an outward nature; in fact, it must be! The outward aspect recognizes the spiritual state of the one who is lost in sin: His soul is at stake, and the souls of those who could be misled by his teaching or his example are at stake, and, depending on the physical situation, others' safety and even lives may be at stake. The one judging must have love for the souls of others as a motivator of his judging. If such love is the motivator, then wonderful; now he must choose words which will be accepted not caustic (Pro. 25:11,12; 27:5,6).

Sadly, much, if not most, judging is inward: The judgment is really about the person doing the judging. One who would judge should look in the mirror and consider a number of things: first, is he guilty of the same or worse (if so, Matthew 7:2-5 is literally for him); second, is the matter none of his business (if so, then he has violated 1 The. 4:11; 2 The. 3:11; 1 Tim. 5:13; 1 Pet. 4:15); third, is he only interested in elevating himself (when one tears down another, he builds himself up; he should take note of Luke 18:9-14). Said or lived

Some only judge in words which are said. They are quite adept at condemning others-and usually do so quite loudly so that others can see how righteous they are (refer to the third sub-point of the latter pair of the previous contrast). Words without action mean nothing; Jesus said, "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven" (Mat. 7:21); by the same token, speaking condemnation without living righteousness is futile.

Judging must be lived. Noah was "a preacher of righteousness" (2 Pet. 2:5), but the greatest testimonies to him have to do with his manner of life: Noah 6:8 reads, "Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God"; and Hebrews 11:7 reads, "By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith." His faith-motivated life was a life which condemned (judged) the world! When one is living righteously, any who are not are necessarily condemned for his life evidences a Standard which they are not reaching.

CONCLUSION

The theme of this lectureship and the title of this study concerns purity; purity has been behind the scenes; here it must be front and center. For judgment to be pure, four things must be the case: first, the judged activity/lifestyle must be impure--if it is not, then the one judging must look more closely at his own life; second, the judger must be pure--he must be striving to live a righteous life reflecting the thought of the song from which the theme of this lectureship is drawn, "Purer in heart, O God, help me to be"; third, the "judgee" must be desired to be pure--the salvation and subsequent righteous life of the one who is judged must be the motivation of the judger; fourth, the judgment must be pure with God and His Word serving as the Standard of judgment!
