INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LIII: 2 Thessalonians

(Continued from last week) Since clarification on that point was needed, the key words in this book echo the "coming" of the first. That word is found three times in 2 Thessalonians with "come" appearing another two. The key verses likewise follow suit, with 2 Thessalonians 2:2 showing that the coming was not immediate and 2 Thessalonians 3:5 calling "the patient waiting for Christ." A key passage is 2 Thessalonians 1:6-9 which shows the justice of God in repaying eternal, flaming punishment upon their persecutors and rest for the persecuted—these would each come "when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels." The key chapter is 2 Thessalonians 3 which showed the Thessalonians that they could not continue in "cruise control" but needed to get back to work.

Though short [it is the second shortest of Paul's letters and the shortest written to a congregation], 2 Thessalonians yet has some important lessons: first, righteous judgment brings reward and punishment—rest or tribulation (2 The. 1:4-9); second, some traditions are good (2 The. 2:15); third, one capable of working, must work (2 The. 3:10); fourth, even through church discipline (2 The. 3:6), one can handle those who are wrong tactfully (2 The. 3:14-15); fifth, the Christian race is a marathon, not a sprint (2 The. 3:13).

On a side note, there are no shortage of opinions regarding the early part of chapter 2 and, specifically, "the man of sin." It is this writer's contention that is a reference to Catholicism and what would be--and yet continues to be--its terrible history of antagonism to God. The seeds were already sown for that insidious system in gnosticism, asceticism, and may of the other early "isms." Its leader, the pope, could rightly be called a "man of sin" and "son of perdition"; in the world's eyes, he is on the throne of God as God's representative on earth--one

might note how the expression "the Church" is used for that false way rather than the Lord's; moreover, to this day it promotes lying wonders--miracles which are not truly such [for instance in beatification]. This writer's brother-in-law, Wayne Jones, made an apt statement following a trip to Italy, the heart of Catholicism, "Rome did more harm to Christianity by embracing it, than it ever did by persecuting it." Sadly, if that religion be the subject of that section, it is with us until the Lord's return (2 The. 2:8).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
