INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LIV: 1 Timothy

(Continued from last week) Among the lessons to Timothy are these: first, law is not designed to punish the righteous (1 Tim. 1:9-10); second, Christ came to save sinners (1 Tim. 1:15); third, church discipline can help those who are disciplined (1 Tim. 1:20) and those who see the discipline applied (1 Tim. 5:20); fourth, Christians are to pray for all—even wicked governments (1 Tim. 2:1-2); fifth, God wants all to be saved (1 Tim. 2:4); sixth, there is one Mediator: Jesus (1 Tim. 2:5); seventh, women are valuable, but are limited in their role (1 Tim. 2:8-15); eighth, qualifications must be met to please God (1 Tim. 3); ninth, the church is God's building (1 Tim. 3:15); tenth, some will just do and promote that which is wrong (1 Tim. 4:1-3); eleventh, godliness should be the Christian's emphasis (1 Tim. 4:8; 6:6); twelfth, men must provide for their own (1 Tim. 5:8); thirteenth, good elders are worthy of honor (1 Tim. 5:17) and financial support (1 Tim. 5:18) and the benefit of the doubt (1 Tim. 5:19); fourteenth, sin will be punished (1 Tim. 5:24); fifteenth, the love of money is dangerous (1 Tim. 6:10); sixteenth, the eternal is superior to the temporal (1 Tim. 6:11); seventeenth, the righteous must fight for God (1 Tim. 6:12); and, eighteenth, riches can be destructive or beneficial (1 Tim. 6:17-19).

Part LV: 2 Timothy

In his first letter to Timothy, Paul had written to encourage Timothy; nevertheless, Timothy, like many today needed continuing encouragement. Paul (2 Tim. 1:1), accordingly, wrote a second letter to Timothy (2 Tim. 1:2). This time, Paul was writing from a Roman prison (2 Tim. 2:9) shortly before his death, probably A.D. 67 due to Paul's pre-winter request (2 Tim. 4:9,13,21). Paul wrote again to encourage Timothy through reminding him of who had sent him, an apostle (2 Tim. 1:1), and to remind him of from whence he had come (2 Tim. 1:5-6; 3:15).
