INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LVII: Philemon

Slavery was rampant in the Roman Empire. Through the centuries, slaves numbered in the millions, perhaps accounting for a third of the population [some sources would posit higher or lower percentages]. Slaves served in many fields from those who were used for sport, to those who performed menial tasks, to those who were well educated. One could be enslaved in any number of ways including being born into slavery, becoming slaves through debt, being made slaves after being conquered, or others. The Bible actually speaks of "menstealers," those who enslaved others or sold others to be slaves (1 Tim. 1:10). The words for "servant" in the New Testament may refer to ones who serve (like $\delta u \dot{\kappa} c v c c, deaconos, or \theta \epsilon p \dot{\alpha} \pi \omega v, therapon)$ or one who is a slave (like $\delta o \tilde{v} \lambda c c, doulos, or o i \kappa \epsilon \tau n c, oiketes)$ or both (like $\pi a \tilde{v} c, pais$). Some slaves are specifically mentioned in the New Testament, the one most recognize is Onesimus; he was a *doulos* (Phm. 16). Unfortunately, he had apparently fled slavery (Phm. 15), being unprofitable (Phm. 11) and perhaps even undermining (Phm .18).

Paul had converted Onesimus, and thought of him as a son (Phm. 10)--as he did Timothy and Titus. Paul (Phm. 1,9,19) wrote to Philemon (Phm. 1) [a loving and encouraging brother (Phm. 5-7) who allowed the church to worship in his home (Phm. 2) {apparently in Colossae (compare Col. 4:17)} and who may have been converted by Paul (Phm. 19)], because Onesimus had escaped from him and was now being returned. Paul hoped that Philemon would not only accept Onesimus back (Phm. 12), but would accept him as a brother in Christ (Phm. 16). Perhaps Onesimus was an amanuensis as the uninspired postscript says—that would depend upon the exact meaning of "written it" in Phm. 19; likely at least is that Onesimus is the one who had to carry the epistle to Philemon. Imagine the dread and fear that could have accompanied that letter; perhaps Paul and Onesimus trusted in Philemon's longsuffering, however (Phm. 21). Paul himself was writing from a Roman prison (Phm. 1,9,10,13,23). The time would have been around A.D. 57-59, the same time as Colossians which was carried by Tychichus and Onesimus to Colossae, for Paul was apparently serving his first prison sentence in Rome (Phm. 1,9,10,13,23; cf. Acts 28:30-31). (*To be continued next week*)
