INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XXXI: Obadiah

(Continued from last week) As for the author of this book, nothing is known of Obadiah other than that he authored this book (Oba. 1:1). His name was a common one, shared by perhaps a dozen other Old Testament persons; it was a compound Hebrew word which tied together the idea of work or service with the name of God, thus meaning something like "servant of the Lord." It is reasonable and likely that Obadiah was prophesying against the aforementioned Edom (Oba. 1,2) from Judah after 586 B.C. This date is likely due to the conditions of Jerusalem and Judah at the time of writing, destroyed and captivated (Oba. 11-12,20).

Since Edom had not only not helped Judah but had actually aided Babylon, Obadiah wrote to show the punishment due Edom's continued pride (cf. Psa. 137:7; Isa. 34:6-9 [Bozrah was capital of Edom (Amos 1:12)]; 2 Chr. 20:22 [Seir is another name for Edom (Gen. 32:3)]). As one of this writer's beloved instructors, Richard Curry, would paraphrase God's answer for Edom's pride in Obadiah 4, "Though ye be as the eagles, I will bring thee down."

The key words are "pride" (while only used once and another time in the form "proudly", its presence permeates the whole) and "shouldest" (used seven times). While the Edomites should have cared for their brother Judah, not spoiling her and rejoicing at her destruction and assuring the thoroughness of it, their pride led them to what would ultimately be their own downfall (Eze. 35). That downfall is seen in the key phrase "cut off" three of the four times it is used; the other key phrase "in the day of their distress/calamity" (twice and three times, respectively) goes back to Edom's unconcern at the suffering of Judah. It seems that every verse of this packed book is a key one, but Obadiah 15 stands out due to the sure, immediate, and just threat upon Edom, "For the day of the LORD is near upon all the heathen: as thou hast done, it shall be done unto thee: thy reward shall return upon thine own head." Perhaps the key passage of the book is Obadiah 3,4 with its combination of Edom's pride and God's promise, "The pride of thine heart hath deceived thee, thou that dwellest in the clefts of the rock, whose habitation is high; that saith in his heart, Who shall bring me down to the ground? Though thou exalt thyself as the eagle, and though thou set thy nest among the stars, thence will I bring thee down, saith the LORD."

Though the book is small, Obadiah yet contains some important lessons; some of those worthy of special note are these: first, pride is destructive (Oba. 3-4; cf. Pro. 29:23; 16:18); second, not to be allied with God and His people is to be His enemy (Oba. 11); and, third, one reaps what he has sown (Oba. 15; cf. Gal. 6:7). Like dynamite, which the writer's mother

would often say "comes in small packages" but has great power, so this small book has great potency and is worthy of study today!

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
