INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XXXIII: Micah

At times it may be difficult to establish authorship, date, and subject for books of the Bible--especially ones of those labeled Minor Prophets; such is not the case with the book of Micah. That prophecy begins, "The word of the LORD that came to Micah the Morasthite in the days of Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, which he saw concerning Samaria and Jerusalem" (Mic. 1:1). There one sees the author: Micah, the date: Between 740 B.C. and 687 B.C., and the subject: "Concerning Samaria and Jerusalem." The basics of Micah and his prophecy were also mentioned in Jeremiah 26:18, which reads, "Micah the Morasthite prophesied in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah, and spake to all the people of Judah, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Zion shall be plowed *like* a field, and Jerusalem shall become heaps, and the mountain of the house as the high places of a forest" [the quote is of Micah 3:12; interestingly, Hezekiah repented at the prophesying of Micah (Jer. 26:19)].

Micah was a Morasthite, that is, he was from Moresheth, also called Moreshethgath, which was apparently in western Judah (Mic. 1:1,14). The name Micah means "Who is like Jah?" It is a form of the names Michael and Michaiah. Interestingly, Micah asks, "Who is a God like unto thee, ...?" in Micah 7:18; none but God "pardoneth iniquity, and passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage" and "he retaineth not his anger for ever, because he delighteth *in* mercy." Micah's background is unknown, but his awareness of harvest may indicate an agricultural background; he wrote, "Woe is me! for I am as when they have gathered the summer fruits, as the grapegleanings of the vintage: *there is* no cluster to eat: my soul desired the firstripe fruit" (Mic. 7:1).

The date of the book is given in general terms, with Micah's prophesying in the days of Judah's Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah. Jotham reigned from 740-736 B.C., Ahaz from 736-716 B.C., and Hezekiah from 716-687 B.C.; accordingly, Micah prophesied for some period between 740 B.C. and 687 B.C.; more specifically, beginning no later than 736 B.C. and concluding no earlier than 716 B.C. As some prophecies of the book concerned Samaria [capital of Israel], those prophetic passages were necessarily penned pre-721 B.C., at which time Israel fell to the Assyrians.

Micah 1:1 did indicate that both Israel and Judah, represented by their capitals Samaria and Jerusalem, were the subject (and, therefore, audience) of Micah's prophecy. As part of a two-fold purpose for the book, Micah wrote to address the capitals of God's

divided kingdoms (and, therefore, the kingdoms themselves) regarding their positions as sinful before righteous God. The other aspect of his purpose was to prophesy concerning the future kingdom (Mic. 4:1-7) and to picture the coming Christ (Mic. 5:2-4). (*To be continued next week*)
