INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XXXIII: Micah

(Continued from last week) The key words of the book are "hear" (used nine times usually as a call for the endangered to heed God, but also used to show God's not listening to the unrighteous or God's hearing the righteous) and "judge"/"judgment" (found four times in each form; twice representing human judges [one of those times apparently Messianic (Mic. 5:1; Mat. 26:67)]; once corrupt judging, once God's judging, and four times representing justice). The key passages are Micah 6:8, showing what God requires of man, and Micah 7:18, the aforementioned play on Micah's name.

There are numerous lessons in the book; here are just a sampling: first, the Lord Himself witnesses against the wicked (Mic. 1:2); second, God's people can become His enemies (Mic. 2:8); third, some will listen only to the one who is obviously wrong (Mic. 2:11); fourth, all nations are amenable to God (Mic. 5:15); fifth, one cannot charge God with wrong (Mic. 6:1-3); sixth, God does not desire even the best sacrifices if they are not accompanied by sincere obedience (Mic. 6:6-8); seventh, one should trust in the Lord, not in man (Mic. 7:5-7); and, eighth, God wants to restore the penitent (Mic. 7:18-19).

Part XXXIV: Nahum

Jonah's prophecy saved Nineveh, for at his preaching the king of Assyria proclaimed, "Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste any thing: let them not feed, nor drink water: But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto God: yea, let them turn every one from his evil way, and from the violence that *is* in their hands. Who can tell *if* God will turn and repent, and turn away from his fierce anger, that we perish not? And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did *it* not" (Jon. 3:7-10). That was written perhaps as late as the early to middle 700s B.C. Their repentance was not permanent, however, for around a century later Nineveh would again be the subject of prophecy and shortly thereafter (612 B.C.) would be destroyed at the hand of the Babylonians, Medes, and Scythians. The fall of Nineveh, capital of Assyria, is the subject of Nahum's prophecy.

Nahum was a prophet from Elkosh (Nah. 1:1), the exact location of which is unknown. Some have suggested that Elkosh was in Galilee, others in southern Judea, and still others would suggest a northern Mesopotamian location east of the Tigris. Of these, the

Mesopotamian location seems least likely. Some have even suggested that Elkoshite is a reference to Nahum's lineage not his location, those this, too, seems unlikely. Given that there is simply not enough textual information regarding such a location or family and that most of the theories are based on tradition or conjecture, the exact origin of Nahum is not overly important and is not worthy of dogmatism.
