INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LIX: James

(Continued from last week) The key words of James are "works" (found thirteen times, used to demonstrate that these brethren needed to be active if they would be justified), "faith" (found sixteen times, used to show faith's importance and insufficiency), "wisdom" (found four times, used to show the divine source of true wisdom and its priority over earthly wisdom), and "patience" (found five times, used in example and admonition in light of their struggle). The key phrase is "faith without works is dead" (found twice, used to show the importance of obedient action conjoined with faith). The key verse is James 1:22: "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

Here are some of the lessons from this packed book: first, trials can be beneficial (Jam. 1:2-4,12; 5:7-8,10-11; Mat. 5:10-12); second, true wisdom is from God (Jam. 1:5); third, man brings temptations upon himself (Jam. 1:13-15; 4:1-3,5); fourth, all good gifts come from God (Jam. 1:17); fifth, the Word saves when obeyed (Jam. 1:21-22); sixth, seeming to be religious is not sufficient (Jam. 1:26); seventh, though most religion is a corrupt pretender, there is religion which is pure and undefiled (Jam. 1:27); eighth, one must not be a respecter of persons (Jam. 2:1-9); ninth, one sin is all that is necessary to destroy a soul (Jam. 2:10); tenth, works are necessary for salvation (Jam. 2:14-26); eleventh, with greater ability come greater responsibilities (Jam. 3:1; cf. 4:17); twelfth, one must control his tongue (Jam. 3:2-12); thirteenth, heavenly wisdom surpasses earthly wisdom (Jam. 3:15-17); fourteenth, Christians must seek peace (Jam. 3:18; cf. Mat. 5:9); fifteenth, man must be the friend of God (Jam. 4:4; cf. 2:23); sixteenth, God rewards humility and punishes pride (Jam. 4:6-10,16); seventeenth, one should not take tomorrow for granted (Jam. 4:14-15); eighteenth, Christians should be honest, period (Jam. 5:12); nineteenth, the prayers of the righteous are heard of God (Jam. 5:16; cf. 1 Pet. 3:12; Psa. 34:15; Pro. 10:24;28:9); and, twentieth, to save the lost is excellent (Jam. 5:19-20; cf. Pro. 11:30; Jude 23).

One note is worthy of addition: Martin Luther wrote in the preface of his 1522 German translation of the New Testament, "St. James is a really strawy epistle, compared to these others, for it has nothing of the nature of the gospel about it." One should remember that Luther was a reformer. In trying to remove himself from the works-only salvation of Catholicism, he went to the other extreme: Faith-only salvation. When there are extremes, the Truth is usually in the middle. Both faith and works are necessary for salvation--that said, even they together, apart from God's grace, would be unprofitable.

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;

But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
