INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part LX: 1 Peter

(Continued from last week) Peter wrote to scattered "strangers" (1 Pet. 1:1), that is, Gentile Christians. Specifically five regions are named (possibly named in order of circulation); these are Pontus (on the southeastern shore of the Black Sea), Galatia (located in the center of Asia Minor; generally, the recipients of one of Paul's epistles, though critics debate which area of Galatia specifically), Cappadocia (located in the east of Asia Minor), Asia (located on the west coast of Asia Minor; the region which received the Revelation), and Bithynia (located on the southwestern shore of the Black Sea). Notably, Cappadocia, Pontus, and Asia were represented in Jerusalem when the church was established (Acts 2:9) meaning that some of the churches in these areas likely predated mission efforts by ones like Paul.

The purpose of the book goes with the date of the book: Persecution was on its way, so encouragement and grounding were needed for brethren any where--even in Mesopotamia--who would be threatened.

The key word continued the theme of persecution. In this relatively short book, "suffer" is found six times. The suffering which is a blessing (compare Matthew 5:10-12 and Luke 6:22,23) is a suffering for well doing (1 Pet. 2:20; 3:17), for righteousness' sake (1 Pet. 3:14), according to the will of God (1 Pet. 4:19), as a Christian (1 Pet. 4:15,16)! The key verses of the book are 1 Peter 1:3 (speaking of the Christian's [one who has been born again in baptism] living hope), 1 Peter 3:15 (speaking of sanctifying the Lord in the heart in the face of the persecution of the prior verses), and 1 Peter 4:14 (showing the happiness, [better] the joy, of suffering for Jesus' name). That chapter, 1 Peter 4, is the key chapter showing how to stand through the persecution.

Lessons from this great book include these: first, trial can be beneficial (1 Pet. 1:6-9; 2:21-23; 3:14-17; 4:12-16; 5:10); second, honor must at time be paid to the dishonorable (1 Pet. 2:17, cf. 2:13,14); third, a godly example can win souls (1 Pet. 3:1,2); fourth, baptism saves (1 Pet. 3:20,21); fifth, one must have the mind of Christ (1 Pet. 4:1); sixth, one must have the proper authority (1 Pet. 4:11); seventh, elders must feed, not fleece, the flock (1 Pet. 5:2,3; cf. Eze. 34:1-6); eighth, Christians can cast their cares upon Christ (1 Pet. 5:7); and, ninth, Christians have an active and powerful enemy who must be resisted (1 Pet. 5:8,9).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;

But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
