

INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XXXIX: Malachi

(Continued from last week) It is not known with certainty where Malachi prophesied, perhaps from Jerusalem; certainly, he prophesied to the Jews (referred to by their corporate name Israel in Malachi 1:1 [which helps to demonstrate that all the tribes composing Israel and Judah had returned from captivity!]) who were back in the Promised Land--the book actually opens showing how much better Israel's return had been than Edom's (Mal. 1:2-5). The book's date is not as simply given as others' dates were. It is reasonable to suggest that he wrote around the mid to late 400s B.C., likely in the 430s to 420s. Why would these dates be suggested? First, the temple stood rebuilt (Mal. 3:10)--that had been accomplished in 515 B.C. (Ezra 6:15); second, there was a priesthood intact (Mal. 1:6-7)--that had been restored in Darius' time (Ezra 6:18) also 515 B.C.; third, the restored priesthood had time to become corrupt (Mal. 2:7-8); fourth, the law was in a restored state (Mal. 2:7)--that took place in Ezra's time (Ezra 7:6-10) 457 B.C.; and, fifth, there was a governor (Mal. 1:8)--but it was not Zerubbabel whose work culminated in the building of the temple or Nehemiah who would not accept offerings of the people (Mal. 5:15,18). Accordingly, it is likely that Malachi prophesied prior to Nehemiah's governorship in 444 B.C. or during a roughly eight year period during which Nehemiah returned to Persia—between 432 and around 424 B.C. (Neh. 13:6).

The purpose of this prophecy [or "burden" a term which was considered in studying the first of the Major Prophets, Isaiah, and which appears in Malachi 1:1] was to serve as a final prophetic encouragement for the Jews, who were still not quite what they ought to have been following the returning from captivity, to serve God with the proper attitudes (e.g., Mal. 1:7,8,12-14) and actions (e.g., Mal. 3:7-12). This "push" was especially needful given the silence of inspiration which would mark the better part of the next five centuries.

The key word of the book is "messenger" which is found three times. Once is with reference to the responsibility of the priest to "keep knowledge ... for he is the messenger of the LORD of hosts" (Mal. 2:7). While important, more important is Malachi 3:1 which spoke of the messenger who would "prepare the way before ... the Lord"; that is a reference to John the Baptist. Jesus said of John (Mat. 11:7), "For this is *he*, of whom it is written, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee" (Mat. 11:10; cf. Mark 1:2,3; Luke 1:76; 7:26-28) [The book offered another prophetic picture of John in Malachi 4:5 in which he was described as "Elijah the prophet" (cf. Mat. 17:10-13)]. The key verses are Malachi 1:2, which speaks of God's unappreciated love, and the aforementioned Malachi 3:1 and 4:5 with their prophecies concerning John the Baptist.

Numerous lessons may be drawn from Malachi, including these: first, God does not accept worship man views as weariness (Mal. 1:13; cf. Mic. 6:3); second, men can weary the Lord (Mal. 2:17); third, the Lord is constant (Mal. 3:6; cf. Jam. 1:17; Heb. 13:8); fourth, one can rob God (Mal. 3:8); fifth, God hears those who fear Him (Mal. 3:16).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
