INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XL: Matthew

"Gift of God" would well describe the One Whose life is the subject of the first New Testament book. "Gift of God" would well describe that first book itself and, really, all of Scripture. "Gift of God" would well describe the salvation accomplished by Jesus Christ and recorded in Scripture! "Gift of God" is actually a reasonable translation of the Hebrew name from which "Matthew" comes. How appropriate that one named "Gift of God" should write of God's wonderful gifts (John 3:16; 2 Pet. 1:3,4; et al) in his Gospel account! The first four books of the New Testament are each of the same sort: Gospel accounts; these are books focusing upon the coming, ministry, and sacrifice of Jesus the Messiah (cf 1 Cor. 15:1-4). "Gospel" [Greek euangelion (εὐαγγέλιον)] is a combination of the Greek words for "good" and "message"; sometimes, the combination is simplified to "Good News"--what a gift this Good News is!

The first Gospel account is attributed to the apostle Matthew; numerous early "Christians" (called by some, "church fathers"), like Papias and Irenaeus and Origen, are to be thanked for crediting Matthew, since Matthew is not identified as the author inside the book. Matthew, also called Levi the son of Alphaeus (compare Matthew 9:9 with Mark 2:14 and Luke 5:27), was a tax collector from Capernaum (Mat. 9:9) who became one of Jesus' apostles (Mat. 10:2-4).

It is reasonable to believe that Matthew likely wrote his account of Jesus' life from Judea in the A.D. 40s for a couple of reasons: first, why would he delay in writing such an account [the expression is "strike while the iron is hot"]; second, many of the early church writers and others have said it was the first book written in the New Testament. Bearing in mind that the first assumption and the testimony of others could be wrong; it appears that at least some time had passed since the crucifixion (Mat. 27:8; 28:15) and it is certain that Matthew was at least written before A.D. 70 which was prophetically portrayed as yet future (Mat. 24:4-35).

Each of the Gospel accounts was written for a different purpose, and the audiences largely dictated the purposes. Matthew was written to Jews who should have appreciated that Jesus was their Kinsman (Mat. 1:1-18) and their prophesied King, the Messiah (Mat. 21:4,5; 16:16). Unfortunately, they generally had failed to accept Him as such! (*To be continued next week*)
