HOW CAN THE CHURCH BE COUNTER-CULTURAL?, Part 4 Phil Sanders

(*Continued from last week*) First, the church can and must preach the gospel. God persuades, saves, and converts through the gospel, the good news of the Lord's death and resurrection. By God's design the gospel appeals and applies to every culture in every nation in every century. Jesus sent his apostles out with the gospel to all nations for all time (Mt. 28:19-20). Jesus tasted death for all people (Heb. 2:9). Jesus is indeed Lord of all flesh (Jn. 17:2). The God of heaven commands all men everywhere to repent (Acts 17:30-31). We must help all people understand their dependence upon God and their accountability to him. Our greatest gift to any and every culture remains the preaching of the gospel of Christ.

Second, the church can live what they believe and practice what they preach. Indisputably, the primary complaint of the world about Christianity comes from the inconsistent and compromised lives of Christians. When the people of God live below their Christian values and morals, they open the door for the world to blaspheme the name of the Lord (Rom. 2:23-24; I Tim. 6:1) and the word of God (Tit. 2:5). When godly people live out their faith, they honor God and bless the whole world. The Lord reminds us,

You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven (Mt. 5:13-16).

We are to influence the world in which we live by our lives, our attitudes, and our good deeds. Rather than listen to the world, we are to be salt and light filling the world with the goodness of God.

Third, the church must increase its faith. Parents must help their children defend their faith and find the reason for the hope that lies within them (I Pet. 3:15). They must

answer the onslaught of evolution in the media and give them confidence in creation. The church must rest its hope in the abundant evidences for the Lord's resurrection and the truth of the Bible. The church needs a "shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one" (Eph. 6:16). There are abundant resources in the area of Christian evidences today. Parents, teachers, and leaders should educate themselves thoroughly, remembering "faith *comes* by hearing, and hea r- ing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17). "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Mt. 4:4). (*To be continued next week*)
