INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XVI: Nehemiah

(*Continued from last week*) The key verses of the book are Nehemiah 4:6, which showed the success of the wall-builders and the reason for it: "for the people had a mind to work"; Nehemiah 13:24, which showed the deplorable state of the children of God's having been reared to speak the languages of God's enemies rather than that of God's people; and Nehemiah 13:31, which provided the beautiful closing sentiment of Nehemiah: "Remember me, O my God, for good." The key chapters of the book are Nehemiah 1 which shows Nehemiah's beautiful, sincere, and humble prayer (verses 4-11) and the aforementioned Nehemiah 3 which stresses the value of teamwork (in spite of one group's refusal to work--the nobles in Nehemiah 3:5).

Among many others, these wonderful lessons may be gleaned from this book: first, God expects man to do what he can (Neh. 2:17,18), for God could have miraculously fixed the walls but relied upon Nehemiah and the people--stated another way, God never does for man what man can do for himself; second, when the foundation is okay, one does not have to start from scratch (Neh. 3:4,6-24), for the job of many of the Jews was to repair the old not build new; third, while not all will do their required work (Neh. 3:5), none are exempt from obedience (Neh. 4:15), for every one had work to do; fourth, one must work even through opposition (Neh. 4:1-3), for Nehemiah and his brethren worked in spite of the opposition of Sanballat, the army of Samaria, Tobiah, and others; fifth, one must have a mind to work (Neh. 4:6), for this is how the Jews succeeded (cf Neh. 6:15); sixth, one defends where he is attacked (Neh. 4:20), for where the Jews heard the trumpet they rallied--this is why members of the Lord's church *must* spend so much time on the necessity of baptism or forsaking mechanical instruments or on church organization or on the one church and the sin of denominationalism!; seventh, God fights for His people (Neh. 4:20), for He could be relied upon to fight for His faithful builders; eighth, one must not compromise (Neh. 6:2), for compromise inhibits great work (Neh. 6:3); ninth, there is a need for preachers (cf Rom. 10:14), for people sometimes must hear "the sense" and be caused "to understand the reading" (Neh. 8:8); tenth, time does not cover sin (Neh. 13:1-3), for the Ammonite's and the Moabite's sins continued to be remembered; eleventh, young people must be taught the "language" of God--His Word, for if they are not, they will sound like the world rather than children of God (Neh. 13:24); twelfth, even God's beloved can sin, for even Solomon sinned (Neh. 13:26; one is called to remember the significance of Solomon's other name, Jedidiah in 2 Sam. 12:25, meaning "beloved of the

Lord"). Clearly, Nehemiah is a book which should be studied regularly and thoughtfully by those who want to serve God and what to serve Him in harmony with others who want to serve Him!

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
