INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLII: Luke

(Continued from last week) Many great lessons abound in this book; here is a sampling: first, one can know about spiritual matters (Luke 1:4; cf. 1 John 5:13; Isa. 1:18); second, sometimes answers to prayers exceed expectations (Luke 1:13); third, Jesus grew the same ways that all children do (Luke 2:40,52); fourth, sometimes the calling of names is necessary (Luke 3:7); fifth, the message and the need to preach it are the same no matter who is the audience or what is the cost (Luke 3:19,20); sixth, no one is above facing temptation (Luke 4:1-13); seventh, Jesus' overcoming temptation is an encouragement to all (Luke 4:1-13; cf. Heb. 2:18); eighth, even the devils believed and trembled (Luke 4:34,41; Jam. 2:19), but that alone could not save (Jam. 2:20); ninth, Jesus knows what man's thoughts are (Luke 5:22); tenth, one must actively build upon the foundation of Christ (Luke 6:46-49); eleventh, those in the church have blessings even John and others could only have imagined (Luke 7:28; 10:23,24), twelfth, there is power in the Word (Luke 8:4-11); thirteenth, attitude promotes or rejects obedience (Luke 8:5-8); fourteenth, one must treat all equally—with love, mercy, and good will (Luke 10:25-37); fifteenth, God will answer the prayers of the righteous (Luke 11:1-13; cf. Jam. 5:16; Pro. 15:29; 28:9); sixteenth, covetousness will destroy one's reward (Luke 12:13-21); seventeenth, sincerity is not enough (Luke 13:24); eighteenth, one must be in the right location to enjoy salvation (Luke 14:15); nineteenth, one can be lost outside or inside of his Father's house (Luke 15:11-32); twentieth, one cannot spiritually straddle the fence (Luke 16:13; 1 Kings 18:21); twenty-first, one cannot live without expecting difficulties (Luke 17:1; cf. 2 Tim. 3:12); twenty-second, one must not lead others to sin (Luke 17:2); twentythird, appreciation should mark the attitude of one who would receive good things (Luke 17:11-19); twenty-fourth, humility is the attitude God rewards (Luke 18:9-14); twenty-fifth, God is the God of the living (Luke 20:37,38); and, twenty-sixth, one must be selfless, even in persecution (Luke 23:34; cf. Acts 7:60). What wonderful lessons, but ones which only scratch the surface of this great book!

Part XLIII: John

The final account of the Gospel was John's. While John is not mentioned by name, it is assumed that he referred to himself (humbly not by name, but one will remember how often Jesus was alone with the close disciples Peter, James, and John) in John 13:23; 19:26,27; 21:20 [incidentally, well-known tradition has John being the lone disciple not to have suffered a martyr's death; one might compare that tradition with John 21:23]. As with many of the other

books of Scripture, early sources help to confirm or even determine authorship in some cases; here, there is general early consensus that John wrote the book and that this is John the apostle (Mat. 10:2), a fisherman who was one of the sons of Zebedee (Mark 1:19,20) and Salome (compare Matthew 27:56 with Mark 15:40; 16:1). The book of Revelation indicates that John was ultimately persecuted and exiled to Patmos, an island in the Aegean Sea.

It is known that John wrote late--at least in the A.D. 60s, but more likely in the A.D. 90s [as shall be seen in introducing Revelation]. It is reasonable, then, and perhaps likely that this book was written as late as A.D. 96 [around the same time as the Revelation] from Ephesus given John's having gone there (at least according to tradition) after his return from exile [in the hills above Ephesus, this writer has visited the house which supposedly was home to Mary when John cared for her toward the end of her days (cf John 19:26,27)].
