INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XVIII: Job

(Continued from last week) If Job wrote the book, then it would have been written from Uz (Job 1:1) which appears to have been a land somewhere along the inside of the fertile crescent given the proximity both to what is taken to be a desert wilderness (Job 1:19) and fertile, bottom land (Job 40:21,22). Could Abraham or another patriarch have written the book? Certainly, if so the book may have been written from the promised land. Could Moses or Elijah or Isaiah have written the book? Possibly, but one would expect to see allusions to their times.

Why was Job written? It would appear that this book was written for several reasons: first, to show how terrible the adversary and accuser of man is; second, to show that God never gives up on those who are his children--though at times they, mourning and troubled and persecuted, may be on the verge of giving up on him; third, to give account of one (albeit in two appearances [Job 1:6; 2:1]) of Satan's two (the other being at the temptation of Christ [Matthew 4:1-11]) proverbial days in God's court--both of which ended in Satan's defeat (Satan does not appear in the book after the second chapter).

Among the keys of the book are the words "just" (six times, referring to man's ability to be just [Job 12:4; 27:17], his inability to be as just as God [Job 4:17; 9:2; 33:12] and God's being most just [Job 34:17]), "innocent" (eight times, in various ways), and "see" (twenty-seven times, with the ideas of both seeing and experiencing). The key phrases are God's repeated (in like terms) description of Job: "perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil" (Job 1:1,8; 2:3), and Job's servants repeated, stinging "I only am escaped alone to tell thee" (Job 1:15,16,17,19). There are numerous key verses: Job 13:15 shows Job's determination to obey God even though He was seemingly the cause of Job's suffering; Job 19:25 shows Job's faith in the future Redeemer; Job 23:10 shows Job's confidence in his future vindication; Job 26:14 concedes the inestimable greatness of God; Job 28:28 defines wisdom and understanding; and Job 37:23, like Job 26:14, speaks to the primacy of God. The key chapters are Job 1 and 2 and 42 with the first to describing the battle between Satan and God highlighted by Satan's "scorched earth" policy over the battleground which was Job, and with the last chapter showing Job's ultimate vindication.

Lessons abound in this great book. Some of the more general but most significant include these: first, God is more powerful than Satan (Job 1:6,12; 2:6); second, even the good

suffer (Job 1,2); third, suffering is not *necessarily* due to sin (Job 29,31; cf John 9:2,3; Luke 13:1-5); fourth, one must not quickly judge others (Job 11:1-6; 42:7,8).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
