TOGETHERNESS IN GOD'S FAMILY

There are all kinds of campaigns. Let us start or let us continue a campaign for closeness, love, kinship and togetherness in our Lord's church. Paul wrote, "That their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, and attaining to all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the knowledge of the mystery of God, both of the Father and of Christ" (Colossians 2:2). We must learn the importance of standing together. We are part of the same spiritual body. We should have one heart. "And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it" (1 Corinthians 12:26). Here are three important things that we can do to promote togetherness in the body of Christ:

We can cause each member to feel that he or she is a vital part. The very fact that one is a Christian and a part of the body of Christ should make us feel close to that person. Paul described that closeness to the Roman Christians saying, "So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another" (Romans 12:5). Each part of the body of Christ is a very important part. Each member of the Lord's church has things that they can do that contribute to the growth of this body. Every member of the body of Christ is an important member and should be loved, appreciated and respected. This attitude will certainly promote togetherness in the body of Christ

We can cause each member to feel togetherness. This is accomplished when we have compassion or love for one another. "Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous" (1 Peter 3:8). When Christians are of one mind they will be united in matters of service to Christ. This one mind will certainly mold and direct our treatment of each other. Christians are to have compassion for one another. Compassion involves loving as brethren and being sympathetic to one another. Christians must be kind, generous, tenderhearted and courteous to one another. It is interesting that Peter said Christians must have compassion, "For one another." John wrote about this love and closeness that fellow Christians must have and used the expression, "With one another." "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). The expressions "one of another" and "one for another" are also beautiful expressions. Members should have the same care, "One for another." "That there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another" (1 Corinthians 12:25). Also notice the expression "one to another." "Submitting to one another in the fear of God" (Ephesians 5:21). So, we read one of another, one with another, one for another, one to another and even just "one another." "Bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do" (Colossians 3:13).

We can cause each member to be encouraged. The early Christians encouraged each other through amazing benevolent service. They sold their goods in order that they might help others. They cared. They shared and encouraged. Paul said, "We give thanks to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, praying always for you, since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of your love for all the saints" (Colossians 1:3-4). The church grew quickly from 3,000 to 5,000 and then to a multitude of people because they had a real closeness and a genuine love one to another. They received great strength, blessings and encouragement from each other. "Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common" (Acts 2:44).

Will you appreciate Jesus enough that you will receive Him as your Lord and Savior? To become a Christian you must hear the gospel (Romans 10:17), believe in Jesus (John 8:24), repent of sins (Acts 17:30), confess Christ as Lord (Acts 8:37), and be baptized to be saved (1 Peter 3:21). Our sins deserve wrath and punishment; God by His grace, has provided salvation through the gospel to save the lowest of sinners!

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
