INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLIII: John

(Continued from last week) Here are some of the valuable lessons from John's Gospel account: first, Jesus is God (John 1:1-14), the I am (John 8:24,58); second, Jesus knows man (John 2:24-,25); third, all men have the opportunity to be saved due to the gift of God and sacrifice of Jesus (John 3:16); fourth, attitude and action are equally important in obeying and worshipping God (John 4:24); fifth, Jesus' commands are authoritative (John 5:10,11); sixth, "son of" indicates equality with (John 5:18); seventh, Jesus would not be an earthly King (John 6:15; cf. Mat. 4:8), and neither would He have an earthly kingdom (John 18:36); eighth, there is no source for eternal life, save Jesus (John 6:68); ninth, it is not wrong to judge others if one judge righteously (John 7:24); tenth, Satan is powerful (John 8:44); eleventh, God does not listen to those who do not listen to Him (John 9:31); twelfth, Jesus chose to die (John 10:15,17,18); thirteenth, the best time to honor someone is before his death (John 12:3,7,8); fourteenth, the spiritual must be elevated over the physical, the eternal over the temporal (John 12:25); fifteenth, love is the means by which God's children are known (John 13:34-35); sixteenth, genuine love necessarily motivates obedience (John 14:15); seventeenth, Jesus had to die before the church could be established (John 16:7; cf. Acts 2:1-4); eighteenth, those united with Jesus and the Father must be united with each other (John 17:20-23); nineteenth, even those close to the Savior can stumble (John 18:15-18,25-27); twentieth, Jesus had to return to the Father (John 20:17); and, twenty-first, there are not enough words to do justice to the Word's works (John 21:25; cf. 1:1-3,14). Many other lessons may be found in this book, but only if one will make effort to read it and study it and draw them out.

Part XLIV: Acts

Luke's "The former treatise have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach" (Acts 1:1), and the subsequent reminder of his Gospel account (Acts 1:2-12; compare Luke 24:51), set the stage for Luke's account of the history of the early church. The names "Acts" or "Acts of the Apostles" or "Acts of the Holy Apostles", as the book is variously called, simply mean that this book concerns the acts or deeds of the apostles following the ascension of Jesus. In fact, the English word "practice" ultimately comes from the Greek prasso (πράσσω), a verb showing repeated action; accordingly, one could say that this book shows the practice of the apostles especially. The International Standard Bible Encyclopedia shows that while the book may have not been originally titled, manuscript copies of the book

often had titles incorporating the noun form of this word, praxis ($\pi p \tilde{\alpha} \xi \iota \zeta$). (To be continued next week)
