
## **INDEPENDENCE CHURCH OF CHRIST~ SEPTEMBER 11, 2022**

## **INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates**

### **Part XIX: Psalms**

The Psalms are sometimes shortsightedly called the Psalms of David. Such designation does injustice to the Psalms not only by ignoring the other Psalmists, but also inadvertently limiting the times and contexts of the various Psalms. Individual Psalms are sometimes designated "Psalms" or, worse, called chapters [for instance "Psalms 23" or "Psalm chapter 119"] when these are actually songs [each being "a poem set to notes" (Strong's Hebrew and Greek Dictionaries)--though the "poems" will not necessarily be poetic metrically often utilizing Hebrew parallelism]; these, too, do an injustice, for each Psalm stands on its own merit--though multiple may carry the same subject matter. The point is one cannot simply begin at Psalm 1 and read through Psalm 150 and think that he has read one unified, chronological whole written by the "Sweet Psalmist of Israel" (2 Sam. 23:1), David.

One may ask, "If David did not write the Psalms, then who did?" Actually David did write some of the Psalms; in fact, nearly half of them--likely around seventy-three (according to uninspired, but generally reasonable headings). Most will recognize David as the youthful killer of Goliath (1 Sam. 17:49,50), the second king of Israel (1 Sam. 16:1,13), the chosen of God (Psa. 78:70) who was inspired to speak for Him (Acts 1:16), and the one who was after God's heart (1 Sam. 13:14; Acts 13:22)--though he was not perfect (1 Kin. 15:5). Other writers of the Psalms included, but likely were not limited to, Asaph (2 Chr. 29:30; 35:15; headings of Psa. 50;73-83), Korah's sons (2 Chr. 20:19; headings of Psalms 42-49,84,85,87), Moses (Psa. 90 heading; cf Ex. 15:1; 31:22 which show Moses as a writer and singer of songs), Heman (1 Chr. 6:33; Psa. 88 heading), and Ethan (Psa. 89 heading; cf 1 Kin. 4:31). Other Psalms have been accredited to Solomon--who actually wrote over a thousand songs (1 Kin. 4:32; headings of Psa. 72,127), Jehoshaphat, Hezekiah, Jeremiah, Haggai, Zechariah, Ezra, and even some of the Maccabees--though their period actually was well after the period of Old Testament inspiration had closed.

The many different authors do require many different times: Moses would have written in the 1400s B.C., David and Solomon and others associated with the court in the 900s B.C., some would have written during the period from the division of the kingdom to the fall of Judah (931-586 B.C.), still others (as Psalm 137) would have written from Babylonian Captivity (606-536 B.C.), and even (likely as Psalm 147) after the return from Babylonian Captivity (post-536 B.C.). The different times of writing imply disparate contexts: national deliverance, national prosperity, internal division, external threat, and external captivation. For

this reason their are different locations and audiences and purposes of the Psalms. The Psalms were written from the wilderness, from Jerusalem, from other locations in Judah, and even from Mesopotamia. (To be continued next week)
