INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE

Part XLV: Romans

(Continued from last week) The letter appears to have been written from Corinth, for Phebe [who may have delivered the letter] was from Cenchrea near Corinth (Rom. 16:1) and Gaius (Rom. 16:23; 1 Cor. 1:14) and Erastus [who both were in the same location as Paul] were from Corinth (Rom. 16:23; 2 Tim. 4:20)--to this day, an inscription bearing Erastus' name is literally among the ruins of ancient Corinth. Paul wrote this letter around A.D. 54, for this preceded Paul's return through Macedonia on his way to Jerusalem on his third journey (Rom. 15:25-26; Acts 19:21; 20:3; cf. 1 Cor. 16:1-6). As has been mentioned, the letter was penned to the congregations of the Lord's church in Rome--"all that be in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints" (Rom. 1:7). Paul wrote to help the Roman Christians to appreciate the superiority of the new law over the old and thereby to answer the Judaizers who were threatening them.

The key words of Romans include "faith" (found thirty-nine times), "law" (found seventy-eight times), "flesh" (used twenty-six times), and "spirit" (used twenty-nine times)--all of these often used to contrast the Old Testament system with that of Christ, the New Testament one. Other key words include "called" (found eleven times, often referring to the church), "righteousness" (thirty-nine times, sometimes used as part of the aforementioned contrast, but at other times describing God's or man's acts; "righteous" is used another four times), and "obedience" (used twelve times including its forms "obey" and "obeyed," with obedience being a necessary act of man's righteousness). The key phrases are "what shall we say then," (occurring seven times, introducing a conclusion) and "God forbid" (repeated ten times, showing a conclusion while almost intimating frustration). The key verse, Romans 1:16, reads, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." Key passages of this letter include Romans 1:18-32 (which could be a commentary on society in this day, but was a picture of how the Romans of that day ended in their so degenerated state), Romans 12:1-2 (which shows that being Godly and not worldly is a "reasonable service"), and Romans 12:9-21 (which gives a model of Christian behavior). The key chapter is Romans 6 which speaks of overcoming sin through Christ and truly serving God and not that sin which has been defeated. (To be continued next week)
