

INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLV: Romans

(Continued from last week) Romans contains many lessons which applicable to the church in its corporate and individual senses and, for that matter, anyone since God's Word is for all! Here are some of the lessons: first, a congregation may be known throughout the world for its good works (Rom. 1:8; 16:19); second, all owe debts that will never be repaid (Rom. 1:14); third, ingratitude is one of the first steps to apostasy (Rom. 1:21); fourth, one must judge righteous judgment (Rom. 2:1-3; cf. John 7:24); fifth, all need the Gospel (Rom. 3:23; cf. 1:15); sixth, one must not use grace as an occasion to sin (Rom. 6:1-2); seventh, baptism precedes newness of life (Rom. 6:3-4); eighth, one can be sure of his salvation (Rom. 8:1); ninth, Christians can and must have hope (Rom. 8:25-26); tenth, providence does exist (Rom. 8:28); eleventh, the love of Christ is immeasurable (Rom. 8:35-39); twelfth, works alone are not sufficient to save (Rom. 9:31-32); thirteenth, zeal alone is not sufficient to save (Rom. 10:2-3); fourteenth, belief and obedience are both necessary for salvation (Rom. 10:9-17); fifteenth, the wisdom and knowledge of God are immeasurable (Rom. 11:33); sixteenth, there is one body (Rom. 12:4-5; cf. 1 Cor. 12:12,27); seventeenth, the Christian must respect authority (Rom. 13:1-7); eighteenth, peace and edification must be Christian motivators (Rom. 14:19); nineteenth, though no longer binding, the Old Testament is worthy of study (Rom. 15:4; cf. Acts 7:2-53; 1 Cor. 10:1-12); twentieth, sometimes opportunity to do good must take precedence over opportunity to do one's own will (Rom. 15:24-25,28); and, twenty-first, some who appear to be serving God are serving themselves (Rom. 16:18).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love,

may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
