INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLVI: 1 Corinthians

(Continued from last week) Pauline chronology is difficult, with few hard benchmarks. Paul certainly was in Corinth on his Second Missionary Journey around A.D. 51 or 52 [which is definitely when Gallio served as proconsul there (Acts 18:12)]. In the course of his Third Missionary Journey, Paul spent three years in Ephesus (Acts 20:31) after which he went to Macedonia [wherein was Philippi] and Greece [wherein was Corinth] (Acts 20:1,2)--apparently abiding for an extended period only in the latter (Acts 20:3). Paul's time in Asia, Macedonia, and Greece on his third journey had to have taken place sometime before the end of Felix' being procurator in Judea (Acts 23:24); Felix was replaced by Festus (Acts 24:27) sometime between A.D. 56 and 59.

The key words of the book are "called" (found seventeen times, used a description of the church), "wisdom" (found eighteen times, with the similar word "wise" and the opposites "foolishness," "foolish," and "fool" being found nearly twenty more; these are contrasts showing the greatness of Divine wisdom over that of human origin), "body" (found forty-four times, used as another description of the church), and "charity" (used twelve times, showing the love which should have trumped the divisions of the brethren in Corinth). The key verse falls in one of the key chapters; in his wonderful chapter on the resurrection, Paul concluded, "And if Christ be not risen, then *is* our preaching vain, and your faith *is* also vain" (1 Cor. 15:14). The other key chapter was Paul's great treatise on live (1 Cor. 13). Key passages of the book included ones against division (1 Cor. 1:10-13), describing inspiration (1 Cor. 2:9-13), and explaining the Lord's Supper (1 Cor. 11:23-26). (*To be continued next week*)
