## INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLVI: 1 Corinthians

(Continued from last week) The lessons of the book are manifold: first, division is terrible (1 Cor. 1:10-13); second, preaching is God's means of reaching the lost (1 Cor. 1:18; cf. Tit. 1:3); third, man is a poor judge of true wisdom (1 Cor. 1:19-27); fourth, the Message is more important than the messenger (1 Cor. 2:1-5); fifth, stewards must be faithful (1 Cor. 4:2); sixth, anyone who is righteous is worthy to be followed as an example (1 Cor. 4:16; 11:1; cf. Phi. 3:17); seventh, church discipline has its place (1 Cor. 5:1-7), and it will always be successful when properly practiced (2 Cor. 2:1-11; 7:7-16); eighth, the Christian has to be in the world; however, he does not have to be like it (1 Cor. 5:9,10; cf. Rom. 12:1,2); ninth, one can turn from sinfulness (1 Cor. 6:9-11); tenth, just because one can do something does not mean he should (1 Cor. 6:12; 8:9; 10:33); eleventh, those who work for the Lord as evangelists are worthy of pay (1 Cor. 9:6-14); twelfth, self-discipline is necessary to achieve victory (1 Cor. 9:24-27); thirteenth, temptation can be overcome (1 Cor. 10:13; cf. Matt. 4:1-10); fourteenth, man's every action should glorify God (1 Cor. 10:31); fifteenth, love is essential (1 Cor. 13; 16:14); sixteenth, the Christian has hope in the next life because of the resurrection of Christ (1 Cor. 15:19,20); seventeenth, one must choose his relations carefully (1 Cor. 15:33); and, eighteenth, labor in the Lord is not vain (1 Cor. 15:58).

As a miscellaneous note, it is possible [though some have suggested other meanings translation-wise] that Paul refers to an even earlier letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 5:9); whether Paul did or did not is inconsequential. What matters is this: If there really were an earlier letter, the Holy Spirit did not deem it necessary to include it, for if it needed to be in Scripture it would have been (2 Pet. 1:3).

"That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:14,15)
