INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLVII: 2 Corinthians

(Continued from last week) There are numerous lessons in this letter; here are just a number: first, there is consolation in God (2 Cor. 1:3-8); second, Satan blinds some to the Truth (2 Cor. 4:3,4); third, suffering in this life (2 Cor. 4:18-5:8; cf. 11:23-28; 12:7-10) is light compared to the reward of eternity (2 Cor. 4:17; cf. Matt. 5:10-12); fourth, all will stand before God in judgment (2 Cor. 5:10); fifth, fear can be a motivator (2 Cor. 5:11); sixth, one in Christ is a new creature (2 Cor. 5:17; cf. Rom. 6:4; Gal. 3:27); seventh, the church must be distinct from the world (2 Cor. 6:14-7:1); eighth, giving starts with self (2 Cor. 8:5); ninth, giving should be liberal and voluntary (2 Cor. 9:6,7); tenth, our giving should be a response to God's giving (2 Cor. 9:15); eleventh, the church is the bride of Christ (2 Cor. 11:2); twelfth, sometimes lessons are slow to be learned (2 cor 12:20,21); and, thirteenth, Christians must examine and prove themselves (2 Cor. 13:5).

Part XLVIII: Galatians

It is superficially clear that Paul wrote Galatians (Gal. 1:1; 5:2); however, there is more that is notable of his authorship than merely that he wrote the epistle, for Paul including this special note: "Ye see how large a letter I have written unto you with mine own hand" (Gal. 6:10). Commentators vary in their views of why this is deemed a "large letter": Perhaps it was large lengthwise (but it is not close to the length of letters like those to Corinth and Rome); perhaps it was written in large letters for one reason or another--some suggesting that Paul's thorn in the flesh (2 Cor. 12:17) was his eyesight, others suggesting that being a Hebrew he was unfamiliar with forming Greek letters (unlikely given that Paul was from Tarsus in Cilicia not from Judea, and given that even in Judea Greek had been common for centuries), still others suggesting some other physical reason for poor handwriting ability; perhaps this phrase was a reference to the grave nature of the letter. While the term "large letter" is of arguable meaning and significance, what is certainly significant is that Paul wrote this epistle with his own hand. In his other writings, Paul would use an amanuensis (e.g., Tertius in Romans 16:22 is given credit for the writing of that epistle) and only personally write the salutation (2 The. 3:17).

It is possible that Paul wrote this epistle relatively early in his missionary career, perhaps in the A.D. 50s. The only benchmark is this: Based upon Paul's account of his

appearing in Jerusalem before James, Peter, and John to defend preaching to the Gentiles against those who tried to remove the liberty in Christ (Gal. 2:1-10) this epistle followed those events of which Acts 15 is another record. This took place around A.D. 49--between Paul's first and second missionary journeys. It must be said that this so-called "Jerusalem council" or "Jerusalem conference" was important not in its deciding doctrine but in its recognizing doctrine (Acts 15:7-10,24).
