INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE Daniel F. Cates

Part XLVIII: 2 Galatians

(*Continued from last week*) Depending on how long afterward Paul wrote, the letter could have been written from Macedonia or Greece on one of the following journeys or even from Syria in the interim between a couple of the journeys. The uninspired postscript says Rome, that is possible, but unnecessarily would push the date much later--word of the meeting in Jerusalem would certainly have been well broadcast by that point.

Paul often would write to individual people, individual congregations, or even congregations in a relatively small area. This epistle was written to a region, Galatia; in fact, potentially this was written to a very large region. Depending on the definitions of Galatia (e.g., geographical versus political) and the maps consulted, Galatia could include cities like Amaseia, Ancyra, Aspona, Gangra, Gordium, Parnassus, Pessimus, Seleucia, Tavium, Tarvium, etc [some of these cities may even have been the same, but under different names]. It could also include Biblically named cities which Paul visited such as Antioch, Derbe, Iconium, and Lystra [these could be considered separate regions like Lycaonia or Phrygia or Pisidia]. By the New Testament period, even Paphlagonia and Pontus could be considered Galatia--stretching it to the Black Sea. To know exactly which cities congregation-wise received this letter is impossible. The Bible student may prefer it have been sent to churches with which he is familiar. The early church writers and historians, popularly called "church fathers," felt that the audience were among the first cities listed.

The purpose of the book was to respond to the work of the Judaizers who quickly threatened the churches in Galatia; accordingly, Paul's epistle to Galatia contains an interesting dichotomy: While Paul wrote with his own hand (Gal. 6:11), likely demonstrating his deep personal connection with and concern for the Galatians; he spoke of them as foolish (Gal. 3:1,3) and marveled at them (Gal. 1:6), demonstrating how easily swayed they could be by false doctrines [especially those of Judaizers] and how disappointed the Galatians' fickleness made him. The result of the dichotomy was a strong, pointed epistle; ultimately, among the Galatians were those who were "fallen from grace" (Gal. 5:4); however, Paul's concern was their obedience to the Gospel of Christ and the associated peace and mercy as the "Israel of God" (Gal. 6:16).
