# INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE

## Part XLIX: Ephesians

Ephesus receives quite a large amount of attention in Scripture, from Paul's first speaking in the synagogue there (Acts 18:19) to Jesus' letter to the waning congregation some half a century later (Rev. 2:1-7). The church likely met in the synagogue for a period (Acts 18:26) as "the name of the Lord Jesus was magnified" (Acts 19:17), as "many that believed came, and confessed, and shewed their deeds" (Acts 19:18), as "mightily grew the word of God and prevailed" (Acts 19:20), and as the church there ultimately faced strong opposition (Acts 19:23-41). The New Testament reveals that the church there had known some great laborers including Paul (Acts 20:31), Aquila and Priscilla (Acts 18:18-19), Apollos (Acts 18:24), Gaius and Aristarchus (Acts 19:29), Timothy (1 Tim. 1:3), Tychicus (2 Tim. 4:12; Eph. 6:21), Trophimus (Acts 21:29), and Onesiphorus (2 Tim. 1:16-18). Over time, the church in Ephesus would serve as an example of a sound congregation of the Lord's church (Ephesians) which was overseen by faithful elders (Acts 20:28) though threatened by persecution (Acts 20:19; 19:23; 2 Cor. 1:8); sadly, however, she would also see false teachers arise (Acts 20:29,30) and leave her "first love" (Rev. 2:4).

To this church in Ephesus Paul wrote this beautiful letter (Eph. 1:1), a favorite among many. Some have suggested that this book was not written to the Ephesians but was meant to be circulated as was the letter to the Colossians (Col. 4:6); however, its needing to be circulated would not preclude its having been written first to a singular congregation; in fact, it is likely that every New Testament book would be freely shared between congregations of the Lord's church regardless of the initial audience of any given book [one will remember that the complete Bible was in production]. While Paul was the author of the letter (Eph. 1:1; 3:1), Tychicus was likely Paul's amanuensis (Eph. 6:21). Tychicus undoubtedly at least delivered the epistle to those good brethren since Paul was bound in a Roman prison (Eph. 3:1; 4:1; 6:19-20)--likely this was the imprisonment alluded to in Acts 28:30,31. The time period would have been roughly around A.D. 57-59.

Paul's purpose in writing to the Ephesians is provided by him: "But that ye also may know my affairs, *and* how I do, Tychicus, a beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, shall make known to you all things: Whom I have sent unto you for the same purpose, that ye might know our affairs, *and that* he might comfort your hearts" (Eph. 6:21,22). Paul's knowing from his long labor there--three years (Acts 20:31)--the character and needs of the congregation and his insight into what would face the Ephesians (Acts 20:29,30; 1 Cor. 13:2),

likely not only made him want to encourage those brethren with this letter but caused him to see their need to have such encouragement. (*To be continued next week*)
