Part III: Leviticus

(Part III: Leviticus *continued from last week*) Given that it is a serial with Moses' other books--especially in close order with Genesis through Numbers, the events of the book basically cover the giving of commands regarding the priesthood during the month between"the first month in the second year, on the first *day* of the month" (Exodus 40:17) to "the first *day* of the second month, in the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt," (Number 1:1). When Moses actually recorded the events could be debated. It is reasonable that he would have recorded Leviticus shortly after Exodus, very early in the period of wilderness wandering which would be the mid to latter part of the 1400s B.C.

While the book concerns the priests, the Levites are only specifically therein named in Leviticus 25:32,33. The more generic and more familiar terms "priest," "priests," and "priesthood" are found over 200 times between them; in the rest of the Pentateuch all together, the terms are found less than 150 times. Its subject would be its audience, the Levites, but also those among whom they would operate, the children of Israel--God had told Moses, "Speak unto the children of Israel" (Lev. 1:2). The three-fold purpose of Leviticus was to set forth the offerings which priests would make (Lev. 1-7 [especially note Lev. 7:37, "This *is* the law of the burnt offering, of the meat offering, and of the sin offering, and of the trespass offering, and of the consecrations, and of the sacrifice of the peace offerings;"]), to show the sanctity of the priests (Lev. 8-10), and to detail their service (Lev. 11-27).

Among the key words of the book are the forms of the aforementioned "priest" along with words associated with their consecration (like "holy" found 94 times), their service (like various forms of "offer" used 545 times, "blood" used 88 times, "altar" used 87 times, "atonement" used 49 times, and "sacrifice" used 40 times), the need for their service (like "unclean" found 110 times and "sin" found 89 times)--the reason all of these are listed is this: Not even one of these words is found in such amounts in any other book of Scripture. One expression stands out as a key in Leviticus: "I am the Lord your God" is found 21 times in the book; outside of the book it is used only 13 other times. What these keys show is that God is concerned that service to Him be performed by those who are specially called to offer such in the manner which He has prescribed due to man's sin in view of God's Lordship.

The key passages of the book include one which tied the should-be holy to the Holy; Moses was commanded, "Speak unto all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say unto them, Ye shall be holy: for I the LORD your God *am* holy" (Lev. 19:2). Another exhibited

scientific foreknowledge; Moses wrote, "For the life of the flesh *is* in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it *is* the blood *that* maketh an atonement for the soul" (Lev. 17:11). Another of the key passages demonstrated the seriousness of God--when He was incorrectly worshipped, death was the result; Moses recorded, "And Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, took either of them his censer, and put fire therein, and put incense thereon, and offered strange fire before the LORD, which he commanded them not. And there went out fire from the LORD, and devoured them, and they died before the LORD" (Lev. 10:1,2). (*To be continued next week*)
